


WHY A BOYS' SCHOOL?

A BOYS' SCHOOL UNDERSTANDS THAT BOYS LEARN IN DIFFERENT WAYS

Boys' schools are built on years of experience in educating boys. Many boys' schools have been established for decades, and continue to evolve to meet modern needs.

Boys are active learners. A good boys' school will enrich your son's education with an evidence-based curriculum pedagogy that is tailored to the needs of boys. A school's learning approach should:

- Equip students with workforce-ready skills in critical thinking, creativity and problem solving.
- Promote self-directed learning, and encourage students to take ownership of their learning, preparing them for tertiary education.
- Address real-world concerns, making learning relevant and useful to students by establishing connections to life outside the classroom.
- Use data to inform a targeted teaching approach, at which students at different levels are taught skills and knowledge that they are ready to learn.

It is also valuable to consider the facilities a boys' school is able to offer your son

- Does the school have sufficient grounds space and sporting facilities, to accommodate your son's sporting interests?
- Does the school offer practical technology subjects and/or an applied learning pathway, if your son prefers hands-on learning?
- Does the school have strong student-to-student and student-to-staff relationships, promoting a deep sense of community and personal belonging?

A BOYS' SCHOOL ALLOWS YOUR CHILD TO EXPLORE HIS FULL POTENTIAL

A balanced boys' only education will encourage your son to explore his full potential, in a nurturing environment that celebrates diversity. A good boys' school will:

- Have a robust pastoral care framework, that nurtures the wellbeing of all boys.
- Build a community that ensures all boys feel a sense of belonging.
- Offer your son with many opportunities to develop academically, spiritually, emotionally, socially and physically.
- Cater to the individual needs and interests of your son, to offer him a broad range of academic and personal development opportunities.

A BOYS' SCHOOL WILL FACILITATE A POSITIVE CULTURE OF MASCULINITY

A good boys' school will build a positive culture that welcomes all boys. When boys know they belong, they feel comfortable to speak up for what they believe in. A culture of diversity teaches students to listen to their peers, and accommodate differences in values.

A positive, balanced culture will stem from a school's holistic development opportunities. By the time they graduate, students at a good boys' school will have had the opportunity to develop:

- **Academic skills** and attributes that allow them to achieve academic engagement and success and access appropriate future pathways.
- **Spiritual growth**, that allows for a strong personal faith and an understanding of the diversity of the beliefs of others.
- **Emotional maturity** that is based upon a healthy self-identity, which allows them to relate to others in an empathetic way.
- Social awareness that comes from a strong sense of belonging, promoting positive relationships, inclusion and true respect for others.
- Physical maturity that allows them to engage in healthy pursuits.

Good boys' schools will have strong partnerships with local girls' schools. These partnerships offer both boys and girls with opportunities to interact and develop their social and emotional skills, at student leadership seminars or other events.

At Salesian, we partner with Sacred Heart Girl's College and Avila College to facilitate our 'Positive Relationships' Forum. The topic of positive, respectful relationships is discussed within our Oratory Program at each year level, within a Catholic context.

We understand that within our community, it is vital we continue the conversation around consent and respectful relationships. We are committed to working with local girls' schools to develop curriculum and initiatives that address this issue, and equip our students with the skills they need to maintain healthy, respectful relationships.

A BOYS' SCHOOL FOSTERS BELONGING AND LIFELONG FRIENDSHIPS

Boys' schools offer unique opportunities to build lifelong friendships. Education professionals at good boys' schools are invested in the holistic development of students, where teachers are trusted mentors. 


A FUTURE FOCUSED BOYS' EDUCATION
