YEAR 11 PROGRAMS



Construction and Trade Program (CTP)

The Construction and Trade program integrates both the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) and Vocational Education and Training (VET) programs, whilst immersing students in the industry. This enables the students to develop key work skills, both theoretical and practical, that are essential for gaining employment opportunities in the Building and Construction industry.

SEDA College WA's partnership with BGC provides our students with onsite experience. BGC is one of Australia's leading vertically integrated construction material businesses with a focus on residential and commercial construction. They have a diverse portfolio in construction materials, building products, transport and commercial and residential construction.

Students that successfully meet the training and assessment requirements will receive nationally recognized vocational qualifications in Building and Construction as well as achieve their WACE.

A combination of this formal education and an invaluable insight into the many facets of the building and construction industry will be beneficial to our students. With our teachers walking alongside our students every step of the way, our Construction and Trade students emerge from our program with tangible skills in the Building and Trade field.

This VET program is facilitated by Skill Hire (RTO Code: 0361), who provide our students with hands-on training at their purpose-built training facility delivered by highly experienced and qualified trainers.

In Year 11, students undertake the core units of the qualification as well as a work placement prior to selecting either bricklaying/blocklaying or carpentry as their preferred pathway in Year 12.

Class locations are fully equipped with all the infrastructure required for a classroom setting, allowing students to complete theory-based learning as well as selected practical activities.

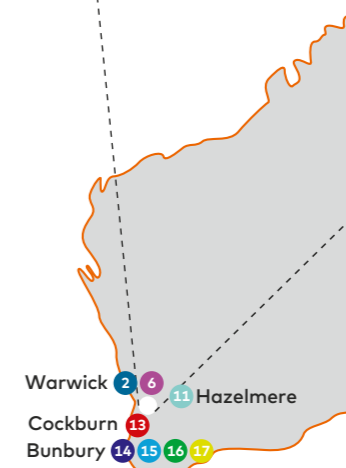

Student Connect

They act as mentors, supporting both learning and wellbeing throughout the program. If concerns become more significant, each teacher will collaborate with the Head of Senior School and/or Student Connect staff to provide the best care possible.

Student Connect provides professional wellbeing assistance in collaboration with the teaching team and parents/carers. We find open and regular communication makes a difference to a student's experience while they are at school. We encourage regular contact between SEDA College WA staff, students and parents/guardians; and where appropriate, external support providers. This is critical to ensure each student's individual needs are met.

Our aim is to develop each student's capacity to access support services in their local area that are age appropriate and best placed to assist.

Student Connect also promotes student wellbeing by developing awareness raising activities relevant to the needs of our students.

MySEDA

MySEDA is the Learning Management System (LMS) that students, parents, teachers and staff use as their central hub for communication, teaching and learning. MySEDA supports parents and guardians to stay connected with real-time access to student assessment, grades, reports, industry experiences and important notifications. MyPlan

MyPlan is a digital portfolio that supports students to track their individual goals, achievements, experiences, and growth during their time at SEDA College WA. Underpinning MyPlans are the Transferable Work Skills and Personal Habits, which have been identified as important attributes, attitudes, and mindsets to develop in order to succeed at SEDA and beyond. Development of the MyPlan portfolio, and the Transferable Work Skills and Personal Habits, is supported with timetabled MyPlan sessions in class and regular MyPlan meetings between teachers, parents/guardians, and students.

AREAS OF STUDY

Student Learning

The SEDA College WA program is planned and developed with industry experts, and connects the learning experiences of our students to the type of activities and projects that might be undertaken when working in their respective industries. The program takes the traditional WACE and VET curriculum and contextualizes it to create maximum student engagement.

SPORTS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

ACCREDITED - VET AREAS OF STUDY

The Diversity and Inclusion Officer

The role of a Diversity and Inclusion Officer encompasses fostering an environment of accessibility, equity, and acceptance across various settings. This area of study focuses on equipping individuals with the knowledge and skills to facilitate inclusion for people with disabilities and deliver effective recreation sessions that cater to diverse populations.

The Elite Athlete

Develop your knowledge and skills to work in the fitness industry through developing and implementing an advanced fitness program aimed at achieving fitness for peak performance. You will work with a strength and conditioning coach and/or other professionals to achieve peak fitness in preparation for a fitness challenge or sporting competition.

NON-ACCREDITED - WACE GENERAL AREAS OF STUDY

Australian Stories

More than six out of ten who call Australia home have had little or no contact with Aboriginal people. The chasm and disconnect between the First Australians and the rest of the nation is vast. The Australian Stories Area of Study shines a light on this divide through the documentary 'The Australian Dream'. Students will explore Aboriginal Australia in all its beauty, hope, culture, history and tradition.

The Athlete

In the Athlete, students will gain an understanding of what it takes to perfect their skills. Students will learn how to perform a skill analysis and design and implement a development program. Students will explore and apply skill improvement tools and feedback mechanisms and compare skill abilities of varying levels of athletes. In this area of study students will explore the

human body, health and fitness related concepts and apply them to their sport. This area of study pays particular attention to athlete strength and conditioning as students develop their understanding of what it takes to be a 'strong' athlete for their sport.

The Content Creator

In this Area of Study students are engaged in creating a marketing proposal for a sporting partner (e.g., Fremantle Dockers) to promote their new community holiday programs. This proposal needs to compete with others in the industry for a multi-year social media content creation role. It requires leveraging social media content creation expertise and sports coaching experience to develop strategies that increase brand reach and grow the holiday programs. This proposal is crucial for showcasing the candidate's ability to effectively engage with the community and promote the partner's initiatives.

CONSTRUCTION AND TRADE PROGRAM

ACCREDITED - VET AREAS OF STUDY

Certificate II in Construction Pathways

One day per week, students will visit Skill Hire in Forrestfield to undergo theory and practical based VET curriculum as they work to complete their Certificate II in Construction Pathways.

NON-ACCREDITED - WACE GENERAL AREAS OF STUDY

The Project Planner

In this Mathematics Essentials Area of Study students will research the costs associated to work in construction as an owner of a small business. Students will then take this learning and apply it as they plan their year 12 Community Camp and budget for 2024. This real-life learning takes on a whole new meaning, when you need to get the fuel budget correct to ensure you make it to the regional camp location.

Building in the Community

In this Materials Design and Technology - Wood Area of Study students will complete a range of design and practical production tasks as they continue to build their skill set. This Area of Study will culminate in a Community Day trip as they bring unity to the community by designing and building sustainable structures for a community in need.

The Apprentice

Learning the ropes before you can get paid the big bucks is a prerequisite of any job. In the Construction & Trade industries, young people start by completing their apprenticeship. This is how we have built our Mathematics Essentials course, where students will learn the basics through a range of practical building activities focusing on measurement and calculations. Who said you don't need Math? Who said Math has to be stuck in a classroom?

The Sales Office

The Construction & Trade industries boast a wide spectrum of sectors and job roles, ranging from crane operators, concreters, site managers and carpenters through to sales representatives. In this English Area of Study, students will engage with Sales staff from BGC and other industry professionals, as they learn the scope of the Construction & Trade sales roles. Students will apply the sales skills learned in class and through these real-life experiences, to sell a brick and even create their own "Bob the Builder" style children's book that sells an underlying message of the importance of teamwork.

First Aid

First Aid is an essential part of the Construction and Trade industries. In this Area of Study, students will gain the knowledge and skills required so to identify and act in response to first aid incidents.

Pathways to Further Education

Students who successfully complete their studies at SEDA College WA have a range of further education pathways available to them.

Throughout their time at SEDA College WA, students are given the opportunity to further explore their career options through the MyFuture Expo, where a variety of tertiary institutes and recruitment specialists present the many opportunities that exist beyond SEDA College WA.

Our partnering universities also provide our students with on-campus visits and experiences in addition to an Information and Application Writing Session to assist students in applying to university. These longstanding partnerships mean that WA universities understand the strengths our SEDA graduates possess, which align with the prerequisites for university entrance, without an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR).

Year 12 students have the option to attend the Notre Dame UniPath program for Metro students, or the ECU UniPrep program for Bunbury students. Both UniPath and UniPrep are designed to help develop the skills needed to succeed at university. The universities work with SEDA College WA to provide a supportive learning experience for students seeking an alternative option to the

ATAR pathways into university. Both programs utilise the most effective evidence-based learning approaches. The programs employ both online independent study and dedicated class time. University tutors assess the student learning experience and support teacher facilitators.

Our teachers walk side by side with the students, recording pathway and transferable work skill development conversations. These are called MyConversations and are a key component in the students online portfolio called MyPlan. SEDA College WA provides students with multiple opportunities to attend Career Expos to understand what is available in choosing their next steps.

SEDA College WA graduates can continue further education with SEDA Group through their Sport & Business Programs. Designed and delivered with the Fremantle Dockers and Perth Wildcats, students undertake dual diploma qualifications with access to networking and practical learning experiences. Students can test a range of career paths and are prepared for work or further study with our university partners.

SEDA College WA partners with MADALAH Limited (MADALAH) to deliver the WA Indigenous Education and Leadership Program - our Baldja Mob.

At SEDA College WA, we continuously develop our learning environment to nurture the growth of our Indigenous students through the Baldja Mob Indigenous Education and Leadership program. Derived from the Noongar word 'Baldja,' meaning 'firmly united,' our program brings together a vibrant community of Indigenous students from across Western Australia. Meeting two to three times a term, we promote cultural, educational, and career development through engaging activities.

The Baldja Mob represents a vibrant community of Indigenous students, whom we are nurturing to become the future leaders of our community. We aim to foster a deep connection with culture, whether it be through the expressive arts of dance, storytelling of our ancestors, or the rich tapestry of Indigenous culture. Students also have the opportunity to attend a regional camp on Noongar boodjar, and a National Indigenous

camp held in various places across Australia.

We identify tailored pathways for higher education and/or employment, mentoring and supporting our Baldja Mob alumni for sustained success in both wellbeing and career. Collaborating with organizations like MADALAH and the Stephen Michael Foundation enriches our efforts and broadens our students' horizons. MADALAH provides scholarships for our Indigenous students, believing education is key to generational change.

Our SEDA Aboriginal Engagement team mentors these young leaders academically and culturally, fostering pride in their identity and heritage, empowering them to succeed in the modern world with confidence and resilience.

Together, we shape future leaders while nurturing a legacy of strength, wisdom, and cultural richness for generations to come.



Rotary Boarding

The Rotary Residential College (Rotary) works with SEDA College WA to offer an accommodation option in Perth for all regional students*.

Rotary, located in East Victoria Park, is conveniently situated near essential amenities like shops, sporting clubs, public transport, and Curtin University.

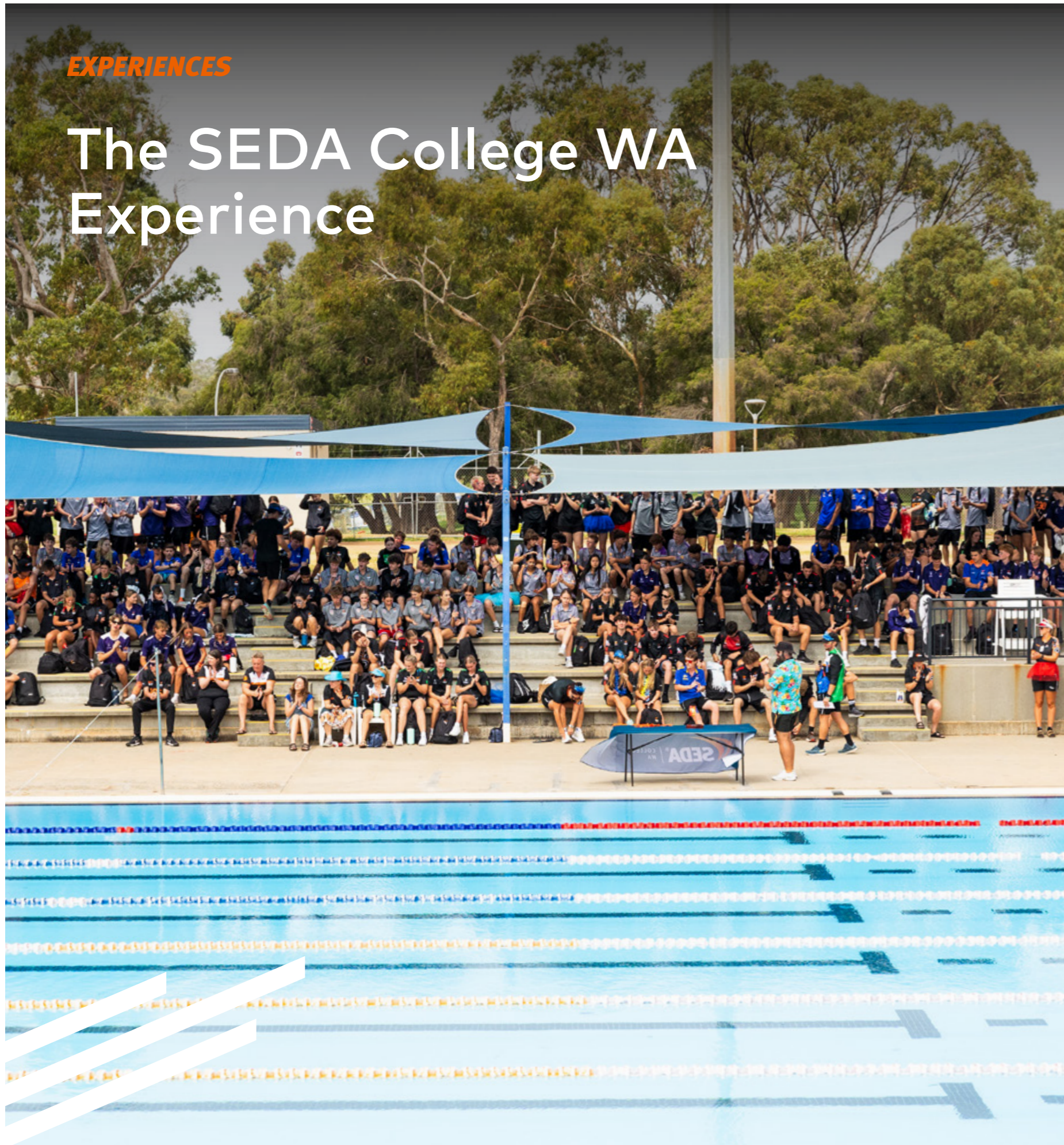
