

Love Learning at MBCS

PRIMARY | A journey of discovery

Our students are well-known, well-loved and well-taught. Our Kindergarten to Year 6 teaching programs encourage students to take risks in their learning, to stretch and challenge themselves as they discover and develop their passions, think together and question their world, and develop firm foundations for a life of growth and discovery.

Our vision, Love Learning, leads us to continually look for ways to improve our teaching and learning environment to ensure that the explicit teaching, assessment and feedback we deliver helps our students meet their targeted learning goals. We are intentional about using educational research that increases the achievements and growth of each student.

CURRICULUM | Kindy to Year 6

In Primary, our key learning areas follow the NESA Curriculum and include English, Mathematics, PDHPE, HSIE, Science and Technology, Music, CAPA (Creative and Performing Arts) and French. Specialist teachers deliver CAPA, Music and French lessons.

From Year 1, all students participate in the Primary Instrumental Program, with small group lessons and ensembles for violin or cello in Stage 1, expanding to brass and woodwind in Stage 2.



SECONDARY | A springboard into new opportunities

In Secondary, we build upon the excellent foundation laid in Primary to instil a love of learning in our students. We invite them to discover new learning opportunities through the wide range of subject and co-curricular choices, and personal development opportunities on offer.

CURRICULUM | Years 7 to 12

In Secondary, students undertake core NESA subjects with an increasing array of electives offered from Year 8. As they work towards the Higher School Certificate in Years 11 and 12, students choose from a broad range of courses, including the option for TVET subjects through TAFE and additional language courses through the NSW School of Languages.

Celebrating the individual

We recognise that the learning journey looks different for every student at different stages of school life. Our students are encouraged to look ahead with confidence, hope and courage. We set consistent and high expectations as we support and nurture each young person's learning. We love to celebrate the efforts and success of our students, whether high achievers or those who have overcome adversity to do more than they thought possible.

Post-school options

We help prepare students for their life's journey, equipping them to grow and develop in confidence, leadership capacity, problem-solving, effective communication and compassion.

In the senior years, our Careers Adviser and NBCS Careers website provide our students with advice and up-to-date information, supporting them in their next steps beyond school, that are a good fit for their interests and abilities.

Learning enrichment and support

NBCS provides a range of support and enrichment learning opportunities. Enrichment opportunities include whole-grade or subject acceleration, deep-dive extension projects, and academic competitions that enable capable students to grow and thrive with like-minded peers. Students can be selected to represent NBCS at inter-school competitions, such as the Ethics Olympiad, da Vinci Decathlon, Tournament of the Minds and debating.

In Primary, our academic extension programs include extension reading in Stage 1, extension writing in Years 3-6, and extension Mathematics from Stage 1. The specialist Learning Enrichment team works with teachers to assess and identify student needs, and works one-on-one or in groups in extension or learning support classes.

In Secondary, we recognise and foster the individual interests and abilities of students, providing choice and adapting to their learning styles, within a well-structured learning environment. The Learning Enrichment team supports our teaching staff by equipping them with research-based interventions and collaborative programming to meet the diverse learning needs of students.



Student Wellbeing

Nurturing and growing our community

NBCS is a school known and appreciated for strong relational connections, pastoral care and excellence in learning. Our nurturing community is founded on Christian hope and the belief that every student has God-given potential, worth and purpose.

A culture of belonging

We are committed to supporting the positive behaviour and wellbeing of all students. Our values help shape a functional, connected community, where students have a sense of belonging and feel safe and supported. This environment allows them to grow in resilience and self-knowledge, and live intentional, fulfilling lives. We place great importance on fostering positive student-teacher relationships and working with families and support networks. This helps us to better understand students, encourage resilience and independence, and ensure each student gets the care and support they need to stay connected and engaged.

Low stress, high results environment

The NBCS Wellbeing Framework is an intentional and cohesive journey mapped out from Kindergarten through to Year 12, designed to develop an understanding and the skills needed to thrive. The stage-based programs ensure students can achieve their best results, while keeping stress at bay. We help them develop social and emotional maturity, along with practical skills, to achieve a healthy life balance that will set them up for success beyond school.

A seamless journey from Kindergarten to Year 12

Starting at a young age at NBCS automatically prepares children for the journey ahead. Familiar surroundings, cohabiting shared learning spaces, and the opportunity to build connections with older students make the transition to Secondary school an exciting adventure. Your confident, secure child can build positive relationships across age groups, and pour their passions and energies into learning and exploring, open to a world of possibilities.



Students and staff have the privilege of living and learning in multi-award-winning, architecturally designed spaces. Light-filled facilities and lush gardens exist alongside bespoke learning spaces, a state-of-the-art performance hall, two beautiful libraries, the 'Manhattan' senior study area, and 'the City' - the vibrant centre of the school complete with an exceptional café.

Sustainable and intelligent structures

Fundamental to the design is our commitment to sustainability, shown through a sequence of multi-level pavilion buildings beneath a spectacular 3,000 sqm intelligent 'living' structure. The canopy column design harvests rainwater to large underground collection tanks. The water is then redirected to flush toilets and to provide irrigation for hundreds of surrounding planter boxes. Collected rainwater is also fed into a canopy misting system that is triggered by high summer temperatures and cools the communal space below. A 158kw rooftop solar PV system supplies most of the school's daytime power needs. Using a sophisticated Building Management System, windows and louvres are automated to provide ventilation in response to climatic conditions. This ensures we reduce our environmental footprint.

Our Campus

Inspiring and invigorating learning

Effective learning spaces

All inside and outside spaces are dynamic and flexible to enhance and inspire learning. Many classrooms have dual functionality, catering to both multi-class learning and more focused learning. All learning spaces are powered by a robust campus-wide Wi-Fi and feature custom modular furniture, floor-to-ceiling whiteboard walls, and large-screen

Co-curricular

Extending opportunities and enriching lives

Whether through creative and performing arts, music, debating and public speaking, outdoor adventure, service, sport, media or technology, NBCS students have every chance to discover new interests, grow their God-given talents and develop confidence as lifelong learners and participants.

SPORT

A comprehensive program of sporting activities and opportunities take place weekly. Timetabled sports activities are complemented by a comprehensive program of optional sporting opportunities that take place before and after school. Representative sports teams also play interschool competitions during the school day. This allows for weekends to be free for family and community participation.

Representative pathways

NBCS

NBCS is a member of the Christian Schools Sports Association (CSSA), which includes more than 80 NSW schools and provides pathways for students to progress to Zone and State level. The School enters teams in most CSSA Zone and State Gala sports days across more than a dozen sports, and also participates in the Peninsula Cup competitions on the Northern Beaches.

Elite athletes

Students can advance to state and national level competitions, both individually or via team selection, through the Combined Independent Schools (CIS) pathway. Talented athletes are supported to pursue representative sporting commitments outside school.



PERFORMING ARTS

Music

NBCS is known for its strong music foundation, wide-ranging opportunities and state-of-the-art facilities.

There are many avenues for students to explore and develop their musical talents with a great breadth of ensembles and private music tuition offered. The diverse program caters for all music genres, from classical and jazz through to pop and rock.

Fully equipped music studios allow students to participate in and take ownership of the whole music process – from learning an instrument, to writing music, performing and production.

Students are encouraged to join one of the many bands and ensembles offered and to take part in recitals, lunchtime concerts, external competitions and eisteddfods, music camps and workshop days.

Annual musical

At NBCS, we have established a proud tradition of staging an annual full-production Broadway Musical. Under the guidance of an industry professional director and choreographer, along with an outstanding and experienced creative team, we perform in our state-of-theart performance space, the Marina Prior Centre.

Secondary students may participate as performers, musicians, technicians, costume designers or choreographers.

Drama, Theatresports and dance groups

Our co-curricula Theatresports, drama and dance clubs and ensembles help students build confidence, enhance self-expression, and improve collaboration skills. These groups, which operate on various days before and after school, are taught by experienced professionals and provide a range of performance opportunities.

ACADEMIC

Programs such as Mock Trial, Model United Nations and public speaking and debating clubs, allow students to extend critical thinking and analysis and develop philosophical and political thinking. A complementary academic assistance program provides opportunities for students to obtain support from subject-specific teachers outside timetabled classes.

STEM CLUBS

The STEM program evolves and develops with emerging technologies, providing opportunities in coding, robotics, design and engineering. Students may pursue state, national and international pathways for a range of competitions.



OUTDOOR EDUCATION AND CAMPS

In Primary, our annual year-based sequential camps program provides students with challenging activities that develop physical skills and confidence in the outdoors, while developing teamwork, friendships and a love of the outdoors. Secondary students can pursue The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award, offered at the Bronze, Silver and Gold levels.

STUDENT OPPORTUNITY WEEK (SOW)

All Secondary students take part in our unique, week-long Student Opportunity Week each year. This 'choose your own adventure' program replaces the traditional annual year group camps, encouraging students to pursue their own passions and interests. With more than 15 special-interest programs offered each year, there is something for everyone. Programs range from performing arts, cooking, photography, elite surfing, hiking, horse-riding, coding and trekking through to a reef study tour in North Queensland and Indigenous immersion experience. Offerings evolve each year to cater for student interests.

GLOBAL OPPORTUNITIES

We offer an extensive range of Global Opportunities that provide unique, memorable and enriching experiences, and extend student learning beyond our borders so that we develop global citizens.

Over their Secondary years, NBCS students can take part in curriculum tours for English, History and Visual Arts, as well as cultural immersions, leadership training, sport or service tours, and language exchanges in nine different countries.
