Columba is a vibrant, affordable Prep - Year 12 Catholic College catering for the full needs of families and students. This Prep - Year 12 setting gives students access to a wide range of subjects and opportunities, matched to current and emerging pathways.

Columba Catholic College students have a sense of purpose. This purpose, of being the best they can be, drives them to embrace the many opportunities available, to achieve a balance between their academic, social, spiritual, sporting and cultural pursuits.

Our College camping facility at Marybank, a 30 hectare property, ensures that the balance between academic rigours and time away in the great western outdoors features prominently in our purposeful curriculum and pastoral offerings.

Our twin boarding facilities on Mt Carmel Campus (for boys) and St Mary's Campus (for girls) ensure that the residential needs of both sons and daughters are met with sensitivity to their own special circumstances. We are proud of our wrap around program in boarding, where students enjoy structured weekend activities; transport to sporting and work commitments and travel to and from Townsville by College bus for weekly boarders. This sense of family and service is a hallmark of the Columba boarder.

The three Catholic traditions that formed the College - the Christian Brothers; Good Samaritan and Mercy sisters provide a model of how the Columba student treats one another, as well as the way in which students work hard to use the gifts God has given them. Each student is recognised as an individual, and is known, cared for and respected. There is no blueprint for the "Columba student" - each child is unique; we see our role as helping all of our students to become the best they can be without compromising the true nature of their personality.

Columba Catholic College is a place where children can confidently be themselves, growing in every way to become competent, confident, compassionate and successful contributors to society. This is done in a safe, nurturing and academically challenging environment with an extensive range of co-curricular opportunities.

BUILT ON A STRONG FOUNDATION OUR HISTORY, TRADITIONS AND VALUES

In 1998, the three Catholic schools in Charters Towers amalgamated to form a single school, Columba Catholic College, operating from the three existing campuses.

St. Columba's Primary School

A Parish School under Diocesan authority, with co-educational classes Pre-school through to Year 7. St. Columba's was founded in 1876 by the Sisters of Mercy, later administered by the Good Samaritan Sisters, and then by lay staff from 1988.

St. Mary's College

A Diocesan secondary school founded in 1882 by the Sisters of Mercy. From 1900, the Sisters of the Good Samaritan administered the College. This continued until 1979 when the first Lay Principal was appointed.

St. Mary's offered Junior Secondary (Years 8-10) classes to girls. Prior to 1978, the girls continued their education at St. Mary's through to Year 12, but since that time, the senior girls move each day to the Mt. Carmel College for co-education. On the same site is a well appointed boarding facility for girls only from primary to Year 12.

Mount Carmel College

Mt Carmel College was founded in 1902 and was owned and operated by the Christian Brothers, until 1997. In 1998, the Brothers relinquished control of the school to the Diocese, but the Congregation retained ownership of the site until the beginning of 2007. The Christian Brothers continue to provide support to the Staff and Students of Columba Catholic College. Mt. Carmel offered a comprehensive education to boys from Years 8-10 and co-education in Years 11 and 12. The well-equipped and modern boarding facility caters for boys only from Primary to Year 12.

Today, Columba Catholic College comes under the authority of the Diocese of Townsville, through the Catholic Education Office.

Columba Catholic College was built by people motivated by: faith, the desire to achieve and a spirit of community service. These are the same characteristics we aim to develop in the young men and women who graduate from Columba Catholic College today.

OUR MISSION

Columba Catholic College students consistently achieve excellent academic results and outcomes. Extension

Students who need help in an area of study may make use of the Learning Enrichment Centre that allows extra time for consolidation at a less advanced level. Programs are available to support students who need special assistance in these areas.

CULTURE & SPORT

The College has a full and varied calendar of cultural events and pursuits, along with seasonal sporting fixtures, catering to the different talents and interests of students at all levels.

Sports are conducted on three levels within the College, as an integral part of the curriculum with swimming, fitness, athletics, lifesaving, dance, skill development programs, as part of local inter-school competitions at Primary and Secondary levels, as part of regional, zone, state and national competitions.

Organised sports for Primary students include: Ball Games, Rugby League, Cricket, Soccer, Tennis, Netball, Hockey, Flippa Ball, Aussie Rules, Athletics, Swimming and Cross-Country.

Organised sports for Secondary students include: Netball, Cricket, Softball, Tennis, Rugby League, Swimming, Cross-Country, Athletics.

Social sports, not organised at inter-school level, include Soccer, Basketball, Hockey, Triathlon, Rugby Union, Indoor Cricket, Volleyball, Touch Football. Columba Catholic College students are involved in these sports through local competitions.

Organised recreational activities include: skating, fishing, trips to other centres such as Townsville for sporting, cultural or social interests, Cattle Club, camping, theatre and movies, holiday trips to places of interest both within Australia and overseas. Organised cultural activities include Debating, Instrumental Music, College Band, Cadets, Art Exhibitions, Drama, Choral Recitals, Theatre, College Musicals, Duke of Edinburgh Scheme and Community Service.
