
We believe that Ignatius Park College students

Our Curriculum

Ignatius Park College provides a challenging academic curriculum aimed at engaging our students in improving their learning outcomes. Our curriculum is carefully structured to allow maximum personal growth within an environment tailored to cater to boys' development.

We are an inclusive school catering to different learning styles. Students progress and performance are carefully monitored to ensure boys achieve their potential.

AT IPC, THE CURRICULUM IS STRUCTURED IN TWO LEARNING STAGES:

1. Middle School (Years 7-9)

YEAR 7 AND 8

Year 7-8 serves as the introductory years which allows students to sample the six (6) core subjects and the eight (8) electives which are offered at Ignatius Park College. The Middle School curriculum is fully aligned to the requirements of the Australian Curriculum and, as such, content includes both knowledge and skills.

Students study the Key Learning Areas of:

- · Religious Education
- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- Humanities and Social Sciences
- · Health and Physical Education
- The Arts
- Technologies
- Languages

YEAR 9

Year 9 provides an opportunity for students to begin to make choices and begin to take ownership of their own learning journey. They will study six (6) core subjects and can choose two (2) electives per semester.

These include:

- Technologies STEM, Design, Digital, Food and Industrial
- Arts Music, Drama and Visual Art
- Humanities Economics, Geography, Legal Studies and Modern History

2. Senior School (Years 10-12)

YEAR 10

In Year 10, students make more refined choices regarding their learning journey and can begin to undertake courses of learning that accrue Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) points.

Students will continue studying subjects from the six (6) core subject areas and three (3) electives per semester.

Additionally, some students will have the opportunity to undertake short courses which can help students meet the QCE requirements in numeracy and literacy.

YEAR 11 AND 12

Our Senior Curriculum is designed to prepare students for the next phase of their lives, whether it be in tertiary study, or preparing for the workforce. Ignatius Park College offers a wide range of QCAA General and Applied subjects, along with VET courses to cater for the interests and abilities of all our students.

Year 11 and 12 students are provided with a pathway to a successful future based on their personal goals and skills. The College provides opportunities for boys to go on to further study at university, secure a trade or move directly into a career. Students are guided towards a pathway that suits their interests and aspirations. Whatever pathway a student chooses they have ample support to find success during their educational journey.

Pastoral Care & Student Support Services

Ignatius Park College's philosophy and approach to Pastoral Care serves to provide students with the opportunity to develop selfdiscipline and positive behaviours in a caring, supportive environment.

It holds students at its centre and acts as a mechanism for individuals to obtain a holistic education successfully.

Through planned strategies and informal experiences, the Ignatius Park College pastoral care infrastructure enables students to feel a sense of belonging, in a safe supportive environment whilst being motivated towards achieving their goals.

To ensure Ignatius Park College is building a healthy and safe community, the Pastoral Care and Behaviour Development system has been based on the following principles:

- The promotion of positive self-esteem and personal spirituality.
- Rewarding positive behaviour based on Integrity, Pride and Commitment.
- Establishing self-directed correct behaviour, developing in students a responsibility for their actions and an awareness of their consequences.

- The deliberate building of social-emotional competencies, psychological and social resilience in our students.
- Teaching our students how to navigate the online world with respect for others.



Forming the foundations of the Ignatius Park Pastoral Care program is the College House System. Students of Ignatius Park College are welcomed into one of 7 Houses, each house led by a College Pastoral Leader and comprising approximately 150 students, broken up into homerooms ranging from Years 7 to 12.

Throughout their life at Ignatius Park College students will belong to the same House and homeroom, led by a homeroom teacher. These homerooms are integral to developing an environment of trust, belonging, support and friendship.

Sport & Co-Curricular

Ignatius Park College offers a wide range of sporting and co-curricular activities throughout the year as part of our dedication to supporting students' whole-self development.

Students are encouraged to participate in several sports, as determined by Townsville Secondary Schools Sport, NQ School Sport and Queensland School Sport competitions. These sports include Rugby League, Rugby Union, Football, Basketball, Water Polo, Athletics, Swimming, Cross Country, Cricket, Touch Football, Volleyball, Hockey and AFL. We also participate in other sports where there are organised competitions (for example, Rowing).

Rugby League and Rugby Union development squads are excellent opportunities for IPC boys to develop their skills in these sporting arenas.

Local, State-wide, National and International Tours are a feature for our many sporting teams each year.

Opportunities also exist for many of these sports to be taken further at an interschool or representative level.

The College is an active participant in local and regional interschool sporting competitions and has an excellent record of achievement in this field. For over two decades. the College has held the Melton Black Shield for Excellence in Townsville Sport continuously.

In addition to sporting opportunities, the College also offers a variety of co-curricular activities for students.

Productions

Teaming up with St Margaret Mary's College and St Patrick's College Townsville, School Musicals are an exciting opportunity for boys who love being under the lights and backstage to participate in quality local productions.

Debating

Our extensive Debating program is available to boys of all ages. Several teams compete in the Townsville Interschool Debating competition each year, with many teams reaching finals. The debating season spans three terms, providing students with opportunities to hone their skills in problem-solving,



Chess

Chess creates a great social activity each lunchtime and students can compete several times each year in the Regional Queensland Schools Chess Competitions.

Instrumental & **Ensemble Music**

The instrumental program runs during the school term during school hours. Visiting tutors with extensive experience come to the school once a week to undertake private lessons with those students who nominate to join the program. The Music faculty has tuition available in Guitar, Bass. Drums. Piano and Keyboard. Ukulele, Voice, Music Theory, Songwriting and Production.

As an extension of our Instrumental Music Program, students are encouraged to join one of our many, exciting music ensembles.

Bands and ensembles are invited to play at college events and the wider community. We're proud to have established the following bands and ensembles:

- The Fire-Starters our junior band for beginners;
- The Flame-Riders our top musicians;
- · The **Deadly's Band** featuring the musical talents of our Indigenous students:
