St Luke's Anglican School was founded in 1994 as a co-educational school, offering seamless education to students from Junior to Year 12. Thirty years on, St Luke's Anglican School has grown with the community over the years in Bundaberg, with over 1,000 students currently enrolled. The School offers a Junior Room (2 years of age) and multiple streams from Kindy through Primary, Middle and Senior Schools, as well as a diverse curriculum for Middle and Senior students to keep them engaged and working towards their bright futures.

Early Learning Centre

St Luke's Early Learning Centre recognises that families have their own culture and belief system which makes us all unique, and we seek to provide an environment that honours such differences. We encourage families to participate in their children's learning journey, to communicate and work collaboratively with our high qualified staff. All of the staff at St Luke's are open to differences in family structure, values, views on parenting, and the role of children in the family.

St Luke's Early Learning Centre views education as a collaborative as well as an individual journey whereby children are encouraged to participate, verbalise and have ownership of their learning environments. We believe children learn and develop through play in an all-inclusive environment where they feel happy and secure.

Children at the Early Learning Centre experience a learning environment which is flexible and open-minded. This design promotes positive and creative dispositions for their future learning years. Educators integrate play with intentional teaching strategies and encourage ideas or new concepts that may expand their existing knowledge.

Children have an opportunity to participate in physical activities and engage in discussions about health and safety. Children are encouraged to explore habits and routines that promote healthy lifestyle and good nutrition.

Primary School

St Luke's Anglican School Primary provides exceptional opportunities for children to believe in themselves and ask that they always give their best to tasks. Academic challenge and risk-taking are encouraged as an integral part of building confidence and competence. We strive to provide a welcoming, caring and secure environment where children can flourish. Our classrooms are equipped with up-to-date technologies and have been recently refurbished to embrace 21st Century learning within a vibrant and flexible educational environment.

Our flexible learning environments enable and enhance the innovative teaching and learning we design for our students as they develop the 21st Century 'super skills'. Our classrooms are flexible learning spaces that inspire creativity and promote deep learning for students through communication, critical thinking, collaboration, character and citizenship. Our Primary School classrooms are a dynamic place, where the teachers and students are able to engage in an array of rich and varied learning experiences facilitating learning embedded in the use of technologies, while responding to individual learning needs.

Through fostering a love of learning, we are dedicated to ensuring every child's formative years of schooling are an enjoyable, fun and secure experience. Our Primary School encourages students to be actively engaged in their learning experiences, while exploring all that our curriculum offers. Students work with teachers to develop core skills in Literacy and Numeracy.

The Primary School curriculum is student-centred rather than subject-centred. We recognise that students learn differently from each other, and strategies and programs implemented in classrooms reflect that reality. Through inquiry-based learning, like Walker Learning, our students develop the wonder of 'Why?'. While the amount of curriculum time for each subject is nominally allocated, teachers are encouraged to integrate subjects where possible, without losing the integrity or academic rigour of any subject. Primary School teachers embrace a number of age-relevent pedagogies in their teaching, including inquiry, collaboration, active and experiential learning, differentiation (recognition of learning styles), choice, and authentic and reflective assessment, while embracing a Positive Growth Mindset.

Lessons staffed by talented subject specialists in Languages, Music, and Sport expose students to a broad curriculum. We encourage each student to enjoy learning through engaging units of work that are linked to real-life experiences. We believe in our students and provide them with opportunities to extend their abilities academically through extension projects, clubs, competitions and independent learning.

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Middle School

Educators at St Luke's Anglican School take inspiration from the eclectic mix of students enrolled in the Middle School Program, who share a diverse range of learning styles and needs. The primary principle that underscores the Middle School educational process is the need to make learning relevant, engaging and challenging.

Highly qualified and experienced Middle School teachers have found that approaching an experiential-style of learning, that encourages students to acquire knowledge from within the classroom as well as in the real world, brings out the best academic results of students in their care. Students love to be able to apply what they have learned to real life situations and explore ideas and concepts beyond the pages of a textbook.

Students in the Middle School become active in research projects as well as adventure-learning in camps and excursions. They undertake peer activities that inspire teamwork, and learning through Service, where our students can undertake meaningful community-based activities.

Our designated Middle School building superbly caters for the type of learning espoused by our Middle School philosophy through the creation of open spaces, outdoor precincts, flexible learning areas and breakout rooms. Aesthetically, the building is extremely inviting and creates a wonderfully stimulating and appealing environment in which to teach and learn.

Senior School

Our Senior School is an energetic and engaging place for students to become mature young men and women who are equipped for their years beyond school.

We aim to produce individuals who are independent, thoughtful and passionate, and who will provide leadership and Service to the community as mature young adults.

We provide a holistic education for all students through a stimulating and engaging program of curricular and co-curricular experiences. We believe that all students have the ability to develop attitudes and skills to achieve their goals and dreams for their future.

Our students can choose from a wide range of academic subjects, enabling them to pursue their passions and plot their course for their future studies.

Students entering Year 10 can already select subjects similar to those they will chose from in the Senior Program. All Year 10 students undertake English, Mathematics, Humanities and Science subjects. In addition, Year 10 students will choose three elective subjects from the remaining list, granting them a well-rounded course curriculum that will shape their own personal evolution.

Students entering Years 11 and 12 are offered a broad range of subjects from which to choose. With the exception of subjects indicated in the Curriculum Handbooks, all subjects are ATAR eligible. Extension English and Extension Music are only offered to students in Semesters 3 and 4 of their Senior program, and there are prerequisites required if this is the course of study students wish to undertake. Vocational subjects are also offered in Years 11 and 12.

We know that St Luke's Anglican School students have bright futures ahead of them. In 2023, 94.3% of Year 12 graduates from St Luke's Anglican School were engaged in education, training or employment in the year after they completed school. 63.5% continued in some recognised form of education and training, with a Bachelors Degree being the most common, accounting for 53.8% of graduates. A further 30.8% transitioned directly into paid employment with no further study.

Student Wellbeing

Research proves that the cognitive development of students is inextricably linked with their emotional and physical wellbeing, and schools that concentrate only on academia can never hope to fully maximise the potential of their students, whose lives revolve around school, work, family and personal issues. Student Services at St Luke's include those areas of school outside the academic curriculum, including Student Protection, Pastoral Care, Behaviour Management, Student Leadership, Middle and Senior Assemblies, Bus Transport, Student Counselling and Student Welfare, Personalised Performance Programs and many other student programs and issues as they arise in our changing world.

St Luke's Pastoral Care Program is clear evidence of how seriously we take our responsibility to educate every unique student. Our guidance and support places emphasis on learning experiences which develop skills necessary to live productively in our complex society. St Luke's students are offered countless opportunities to practice decision-making, problem solving, develop positive thought patterns, build sound interpersonal relationships, and work cooperatively and interdependently with others.

Personalised Performance Programs

The School offers a number of Personalised Performance Programs to enable students, who are elite performers in their chosen field, the opportunity to balance these commitments with academic endeavours. Entry into the program requires students to meet a certain level of achievement in regard to their co-curricular activity. Programs are devised on an individual basis to give flexibility, thereby ensuring students have every opportunity to achieve their potential academically as well as to meet the demands involved in training and preparation for the co-curricular activity.

Co-Curricular Activities

All co-curricular activities are underpinned by a philosophy of participation. It is important that all students feel they have an opportunity, irrespective of ability, to be involved in and to contribute to the programs. In all areas students achieve to a very high level supported by outstanding staff.

In addition to Sporting and Arts activities, the Primary School also offer Science Club, Code Club, and the 'Big Ideas' Expo. Book Hire Fees

Unless a prior arrangement has been made with the Business Manager and/or Front Office Manager/Fees regarding late payment of the account, an Administration Levy will be charged to all accounts not paid in full by the end of Term. \$25 per month will be charged to cover the cost of collecting outstanding accounts.

Early Learning Centre Enrolments

We invite you to book a tour and experience first-hand the caring and exciting environment that our Early Learning Centre children love. Your child must have reached the age of 2 years before they are eligible to commence in the Junior room. Children attending the Pre-Kindy program are between the ages of 3 and 4 years and fully toilet trained. Children who enrol in the Kindy class must have turned 4 years of age before 30 June in the year of entry to be eligible to commence.
