Our state-of-the-art facilities include an aquatic centre opened in 2021, a purpose-built theatre opened in 2019, a revived Arts precinct with auditoriums and dance studios, a gymnasium and community centre opened in 2016, bright and welcoming libraries, flexible-use classrooms, communal areas, sporting fields and more!

Of the Year 11-12 cohort, two-thirds enrol in ATAR level subjects, and one-third take up opportunities in Vocational Education & Training, including nationally recognised Certificates and workplace learning. The goal is to successfully transition students from the College to post-school options.
